Remember, David, when you strike a match to start the fire, be sure that you're wearing glasses. Turn your face away so that sparks won't accidentally fly into your eye!

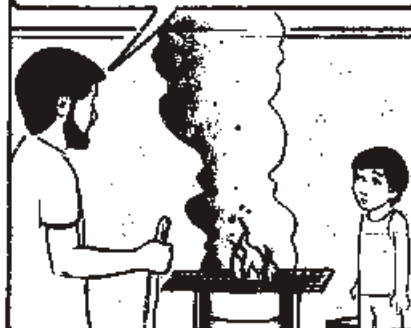
Yes, Sir! Grandpa says that fires are very dangerous! I'll stand back and away!
