FLEE BAGS

THE NEED FOR FLEE BAGS.

D: "NE SPULD ALL HAVE AN ESCATE CASE
PACKED—A "FLEE BAG"! This would be a good
idea all over the world in the Fanily. Allways keep a case packed for a quick escape
in case of any energency. Have you got all
your valuable papers, work, logs, dianies in

MYOUR PLEEDAG OUGHT TO BE NEAR YOUR BED MERE YOU KNOW MERE IT IS, & MERE YOU CAN GET YOUR HANDS ON IT IN THE DANK! Where Is my fleebag?—It's by our bed! All I have to do Is reach out & great by It & run! I live out of It! I never unpack It! I'm not going to be doing any last-minute hunting around for stuff to put in. I've got my most valuable papers & everything that is important in there."

"IT'S MORE IMPORTANT TO SAVE YOUR LIFE THAN YOUR MORK, but you're supposed to have your flesbag with you, all necessary clother ing & valuable papers so that you can grab than Immediately & get out!"

Show at least one other person in the loate where you keep your fleebeg & any other vital inreplaceable papers after that would have no be executed in an emargency. Then, if an emargency courned white you were absent, someone also could quickly grab all your vital materials & evacuate them, if necessary.

2. CONTENTS OF FLEE BAGS

Just take things that are essential. Ask yourself "What can I possibly not do with out?" That should be your rule.

It might not be possible to keep all the litters needed for a fleebeg in it all the litter, in which case you can make a list of litters which need to be thrown in at the last minute, & keep the list in the top of your fleebeg, so you can put those litters in very quickly, if necessary.

Some things to include in a fleebeg are: a Valuable, irreptaceable papers, such as passports, birth & merriage certificates, bank books, flee funds, contracts, diarries, address books, felling lists, car papers, (& keys), & papers vital to your ministry, etc. Some of these important papers should also be photocopied & the copies stored screeninger else. It's pretty hard to get a new passport if you don't even have the number of the old one.

 c) Bible, ofter devotional literature such as MCPs, etc. d) Atlas, local maps, first aid handbook.

- e) Ongoing air tidest, if you have one, f) Enough cash in the local currency to last you at least a few days in a hotel if necessary, as well as buy an air tidest out of the country, if you don't have one.

- strong currency for a landing fundh) A flashlight, condies & matches-
- Same decent clothing, about 2 changes, so you can look respectable. Have something warm in case you end up somewhere cold.
- j) Some basic toiletries, & possibly some smack & first aid supplies. Water purification tablets.

3. FLEE FUNDS.

Each Home member should have:

1. The equivalent of \$0.5.50=100.= in local currency on them at all times. This should be enough to prove financial responsibility, or check into a hotel if need be-

11. A prepaid air ficket out of the country or enough money to buy one.

III. A sum of travellers chaques in a strong currency in their own name in cathey should be taken away, imprisoned etc., & would be left behind. This can also serve as a landing fund if they had to leave the country.

4. FLEE SUPPLIES.

You certainly wouldn't want to run into the basement of a tortering building to get it!"

Keep such a kit partable, possibly not pigger than a suitcese, you might want to include water purification tablets, some way to cook, some blankets & first ald supplies. (Tents are very nice to have if you live in parthquakerprone areas.)
